JOB TITLE: FAMILY RESOURCE WORKER (YOUTH OUTREACH)

Union: BCGEU – Community Subsector Classification Grid - 33

Hours: 22 hours per week over four days per week

Wage: Step 2 (to start) - \$31.54 per hour

Job Summary: Works as part of a collaborative team to support youth and their families to establish and achieve realistic goals. Provides support, information, resources, mediation and advocacy to youth and families referred by both the Ministry of Children and Family Development (MCFD) and the community. Provides outreach support and a weekly group activity to youth 13 to 19 years under MCFD contract. Works collaboratively with colleagues to ensure delivery of programs and services at James Bay Community Project.

Reports to: Executive Director

Key Duties and Responsibilities:

- Work with youth and families to assess and plan for needs, identify strengths, identify required resources, support linkages, assist with service navigation and referrals and to do follow-up
- Plan and run group support program for youth by determining content and structure. (Currently involves planning and facilitating a youth food skills program.)
- Facilitate family communication meetings
- Facilitate youth and parent support and mentoring
- Assist with service navigation and referrals, working with other resources in Victoria
- Liaise with parents/caregivers, school counselors, other agency workers, mental health counselors and Ministry for Children & Family Development

- Maintain a thorough knowledge of community resources and provide information/referrals to parents/caregivers and to youth to support access of additional community resources
- Collaborate with other staff
- Ensure that accurate program and necessary participant records are maintained and that required reports are submitted and all pertinent documentation is complete
- Perform other duties as required.
